Swanson Wins 2022 First Tee National Championship

We had two boys from our program compete in the annual First Tee National Championship this year! Hunter Swanson and Kyle Leydon competed for the second consecutive year. Last year Hunter finished 2nd after losing in a playoff, while Kyle finished 10th. They returned this year looking to improve on their finishes from 2021. Hunter won the boys' division of the First Tee National Championship at Notre Dame University's Warren Golf Course. While Kyle Finished T7 +12 for the tournament.

The event, June 27-July 1, brought together First Tee's elite golfers for an opportunity to showcase how the program has helped build the strength of character needed to play at the next level.

Swanson, 18, recently graduated from Northfield High School and has signed on to play collegiately at the University of Colorado in the next school year. Ranked No. 111 in the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) boys rankings, Swanson was the only boys' division competitor to finish under par with an overall score of 1-under-par 212 (70-72-70). He played his final 14 holes bogeyfree and tallied his three birdies on Friday at the sixth, 10th and 17th holes on the way to capping off a wire-to-wire victory by three strokes.

Said Swanson: "Last year,





definitely, wasn't the happiest moment but I was proud of myself for at least playing well. And today, to come back and actually get the win this time, feels a lot more special. Kind of like I finished what I started. It's an honor, truly. I wouldn't be anywhere, where I'm at, without the First Tee."

"Congratulations to all of the competitors who participated in this event," said Greg McLaughlin, First Tee CEO. "Especially to Hunter Swanson, winner of the boys' division. He played with confidence and composure, and we look forward to watching him pursue his goals both on and off the golf course."

First Tee National Championship is held annually at various college golf courses around the nation providing First Tee participants the opportunity to network with others from across the country and take in the college experience. University of Notre Dame's Warren Golf Course hosted the second-annual Championship, following the inaugural year at Clemson University's The Walker Course.

The field included 23 boys and 22 girls, ages 14-19, who were selected based on their golf skills and competitive golf experience including four players ranked in the top 250 on both the American Junior Golf Association and Junior Golf Scoreboard. Players came
