


First Tee - GVR Coat Drive

Here's what Laila had to say about her First Tee experience:

"My name is Laila Stavely, and I have been a participant at First Tee for 11 years. Over the years, I have been exposed to many different opportunities that the program offers. I have been involved in weekly classes and have had the chance to be both a participant and a junior coach. I have also expanded my experience outside of playing, like caddying or volunteering. I get to volunteer with the Leadership Council, as well as for events that many of the participants get to partake in, like helping with the summer Opens or maintaining the Par 3 course. I have developed foundational life skills through our core values that I have been able to present both on and off the course. These values have played a critical role in my friendships and my growing confidence with teamwork. These years have been fundamental, and I am truly grateful for the continuity First Tee has had in my life."

Colorado Golf Foundation

The Colorado Golf Foundation has been a vital supporter of First Tee – Green Valley Ranch since 2017. Over the years, the Foundation has provided more than \$72,000 in grants to help grow the First Tee – GVR Caddie Program. Their generosity gives our kids valuable on-course experience and lessons that reach far beyond golf.

This partnership has helped build and sustain one of the few public golf course caddie programs in Colorado that offer free caddies to golfers using 100% youth caddies. It gives teenagers the chance to learn responsibility, communication, and professionalism while serving the players at Green Valley Ranch.

The caddie class is part of our regular First Tee curriculum but represents an important next step for participants who want to take their experience further. It allows them to apply what they have learned in class to real situations on the course while developing maturity and leadership through every round. This program also provides meaningful summer employment opportunities and, for some, the chance to apply for and earn an Evans Scholar Caddie Scholarship to CU Boulder.

Founded in 2011, the Colorado Golf Foundation continues to expand access to the game and create opportunities for future leaders both in golf and in life. Their commitment helps build confidence, character, and community through the sport.
